

The bushes and the plants need strimmed/chopped/hacked from the pathway to the bird hide. We would like to start using this as a castle and a playden but can't reach it because it is overgrown.

We need an area of the garden area dug up (it would probably need a rotavator) We are hoping to make a den building area and need this area cleared.
