RECIPE CORNER

Thanks go to Mrs Anna Burnett from Upper Spittalton for this additions recipe column. She is trying to get us all in the mood for summer with these delicious fruity recipes.

Lemon Cream

Grease 6" round cake tin $2\frac{1}{2}$ fl.oz. Milk 2 level tablespoons caster sugar grated rind & juice of 2 lemons 1 level dessertspoon gelatine 1 egg yolk 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ fl. oz. Double cream 2 large egg whites

Place milk, sugar, lemon rind, gelatine & egg yolk together in blender or liquidiser. Blend for $\frac{1}{2}$ minute and then pour mixture into small saucepan & stir over very gentle heat for 3 - 4 minutes till hot but not boiling. Return mixture to liquidiser and blend again adding lemon juice & $\frac{1}{4}$ pint of the cream. When blended pour mixture into bowl stirring occasionally till syrupy. Whip remaining $7\frac{1}{2}$ fl. Oz. cream lightly until it begins to thicken. In another bowl whisk egg whites till stiff & fold into lemon mixture followed by cream. Pour into tin, cover & chill till firm.

Turn out & decorate - cuts like a cake.

Marshmallow Delight

1 tin crushed pineapple

1 tin mandarin oranges

1 pkt marshmallows

I tub soured cream

Drain juice from fruit & cut up the marshmallows. Mix together drained fruit, marshmallows, soured cream. Leave in fridge overnight & finish by topping with cream.

Orange Haze

1 orange jelly melted with $\frac{1}{4}$ pint water

2 oranges

2 oz caster sugar

3 standard eggs separated

Add grated rind & juice of oranges to melted jelly. Leave until just beginning to set. Whisk together

egg yolks & sugar, & then whisk into jelly. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites & leave till set.

COMMUNITY HALL AGM

The AGM was held on 27 March. An overview of the activities at Camphill was followed by the formal part of the meeting. Chairman Jimmy Maxwell's report is below . . .

"I would like to report another successful year for the hall with new groups using the hall on a regular basis, e.g.: Camphill, Aerobics, BAGS, Beetle Drives are now very popular, great fun! and hectic activity while being played.

The year started off with the new committee members in place, the secretary's job was split between minutes and bookings for the first time, this has worked well with neither secretary feeling their job is to onerous.

A questionnaire was sent out to every household with a copy of the Grapevine to gain enough information from the community to prioritise hall improvements. The results of the questionnaire were discussed at a Public Meeting and it was decided that the best value for money option was a complete rebuild of our hall. This has been the main focus for the committee this year, an Awards for All grant was successfully applied for and this enabled us to purchase tables and chairs and also carryout a Feasibility Study for a complete rebuild of our hall.

A building committee was formed and an Architect was appointed to help plan a design for the new hall and make a Main Grants application to the Community Fund for full rebuild costs. This process involved visits to other halls to gain ideas on costs, layouts and storage space. Many meetings were required to complete the application for Scheme Design Study grant funding, at this stage the whole project has to be detailed with a Business Plan and relevant Check List having to be submitted. Many hours of work went into this application but overall it was enjoyable and good experience for everyone involved. The application has now been accepted after the hall committee agreed to lease the hall from the trustees, and this meets the Community funds requirements regarding security of tenure of the building. The assessment stage of the application has started and it is likely to take several months to decide if we are to be successful.

Community events organised during the year included a Sports Night and BBQ, which was a great success with the ladies sack race being the highlight of the evening.

The hall has been well used during the year with eleven groups using the hall regularly, there are other groups who would like to use the hall if the facilities were suitable. The work on the grant application brought out new ideas on how to promote the hall and encourage new users. These can be followed up when the hall has been upgraded. I would like to conclude my report by thanking everyone on the committee for they're considerable help and support during the year. Thank you"
